

Now that our fabulous Quilt Spectrum is done, we can turn our energy and focus to the August Stash Sale. Your unwanted fabric and notions would be perfect for the Public Stash Sale on Friday, August 2 from 10am-2pm. Just like last year, members will be able to shop on Thursday, August 1st, prior to the Public Sale on Friday. You'll get the best selection! With your shopping done, the committee hopes that you'll then be free to volunteer at the Public Sale. Members' shopping times will be in a later newsletter. There is a chart below listing the various items that will be accepted for sale.

We learned many things last year about conducting this sale and have heard and appreciated your feedback. There will be changes in how your fabric should be packaged for sale, but the labeling system will remain the same. At the June 6 meeting, there will be a demonstration of a suggested way to package your fabric without using plastic bags. For labeling, please let Ary know if you are participating again this year and want the same seller number as last year. If you are a new participant – welcome! You may get a seller number at the May meeting.

NEW: If you are donating 100% of the proceeds of your cotton quilting fabric to the guild, you may bring that fabric beginning with the June 6 meeting. That night we cannot accept anything other than the quilt fabric which 100% of the proceeds will go to the guild. The last day to bring your donated fabric is July 11, our Ice Cream Social. If you are donating a large quantity of fabric, the committee would greatly appreciate it if you would contribute a couple of hours to the measuring and packaging of your donation.

Here are items that will be accepted for the sale:

- **Fabric**: quilting cotton in yardage, panels, kits, FQs, or usable size but not scraps
- Wool
- Books
- Magazines: bundles of at least 4
- Yarn
- Craft supplies
