- O Your name must be on the back of the quilt. Quilt labels are preferred.
- Place your quilt in a pillowcase or other fabric bag with your name on the bag. One quilt per bag. No plastic or paper bags.

PICK UP: SATURDAY, APRIL 20, 2024 5:00 – 6:00 pm

PIECED QUILTS are those in which the majority (51% or more) of the quilt is constructed using traditional techniques, patterns and inspirations from existing quilt history. This category may be subdivided into 2 or 3 size groups depending on the number of entries received.

APPLIQUED QUILTS are appliqued on the majority (at least 51%) of the quilt, and contain fabric designs cut out of one fabric and then stitched or otherwise applied to the surface of another fabric.

HAND-QUILTED QUILTS are those in which the majority (51% or more) of the quilt is hand-quilted.

MODERN QUILTS should follow the general guidelines of using negative space, simplicity of design, asymmetry, and bold colors.

PANEL QUILTS are those which the majority (51% or more) of the front of the quilt is a panel.

MINIATURE QUILTS are constructed quilts but in miniature. Dimensions should be no larger than 24" per side and no more than 4" per block.

POTPOURRI is anything quilted that does not fit into the other categories. Examples could be a tree skirt, stocking, purses, hats, thread catchers, or anything made with fabric and thread.

2024 CHALLENGE are the quilts created with black to celebrate the Roaring with the 20's guild theme this year.

HAAQG BOM ('23-'23) are quilts made during the 2022-2023 block of the month with HAAQG.

YOUTH QUILTS are constructed and bound by a child who is a high school senior or younger, and no older than 19. They may be quilted by someone other than the youth. Youth entries should be sponsored by a guild member.

MACHINE EMBROIDERED / EMBELLISHED QUILTS have 3-dimensional additions which the majority (51% or more) are done by machine, such as embroidery, fabric manipulation, beads, sequins, fibers, etc. Examples of fabric manipulation would include folds, yo-yo's, cathedral windows, ragged edges.

HAND EMBROIDERED / EMBELLISHED QUILTS Same as above, only the majority (51% or more) is done by hand.

INVITATIONAL QUILTS are 2023's first place winners and are on display only.

QUILT SLEEVE INSTRUCTIONS

Sleeves are required for all quilts with a top measurement of 48" or more in order to be displayed. Use the following directions to create and attach the sleeve:

- 1. Measure the width of the quilt.
- 2. Cut a muslin strip 5" shorter than the width of the quilt and 5" wide. Cut this strip in half lengthwise.
- 3. Turn all edges under ½" on both pieces.
- 4. Measure 1" down from the top of the quilt and mark. Measure 3" below the first mark and make another mark.
- 5. Position the two strips so that the long edge is at the 1" mark and the short edge is about 2" away from the sides of the quilt. There will be about a 3" space between the two strips.
- 6. Hand sew the top edge of the strips to the 1" marking and the bottom of the strips to the second 3" marking. Do not stitch down the short ends of the strips.
 NOTE: The sleeve will not lie flat against the quilt. It must have a gap so it hangs flat with the pipe.
